
July 4th - Our Patriotic and Festive Parade

Todd Ruppel: From Runner to Fundraiser

In an effort to enjoy a passion for running with friends, Todd Ruppel and neighbor Kristin Idalski put an idea into action in 2010. They formed the Rivertown Runners (RTR) to host community races, encourage runners and raise money for local charities.



Still going strong, it is well-known for its weekend group runs and organizing the Sleepy Hollow Half Marathon and the Halloween 10K marathon.

RTR counts more than 150 members from PM and the river communities and has raised more than \$650,000 for charities including Kids' Club of Tarrytown and Sleepy Hollow, the RSHM Life Center, the YMCA and other community organizations. It helped support a new playground at Morse school and renovations at the Sleepy Hollow Lighthouse. RTR also receives support from local businesses including Prestige Consumer Healthcare, J.P. Doyle's and MVP Health Care. From its mission statement, "Funds are distributed to local

organizations and charities that promote and support health education, healthy lifestyles as well as provide for the needs of the community."

"Running with others makes the time go faster and be more fun," Ruppel said recently. "And with our RTR Outreach Fund we have helped many local organizations."

Ruppel continues as president, along with Manor neighbor Jim Huvane as treasurer.

In 1990 Ruppel and his wife, Roberta, moved from Hastings-On-Hudson to the Manor. He began actively running at 40 years old when a friend challenged him to run 3 miles in the Manor and he "got hooked." The Ruppels have two grown children, Matthew, an emergency room physician in Concord, N.H, and a daughter, Genevive, a nurse in Philadelphia.

But Todd, a former marathon runner (New York Clty and Boston), isn't running nowadays. A retired insurance executive he currently enjoys playing golf and being close to the Hudson River. Roberta, a former dance teacher, is a fitness/personal trainer.

A major RTR event is the Sleepy Hollow Halloween 10K on Sunday, October 28, which draws roughly 300 participants. Costumes are encouraged. For information, go to http://www.rivertownrunners.org/
