Village Mayor Keeps Us in the Know

At our annual PMIA meeting Sleepy Hollow Mayor Martin Rutyna, accompanied by most of his Village Board, spoke to a packed house at the Hudson Valley Writers Center about plans for 2024 that might affect us in Philipse Manor. "We want to give people outside places to go and come together as a community," said the Mayor. "And we also want to make improvements that will beautify our neighborhoods."

A few highlights from the Mayor:

- The Village has instituted a mobile parking app to make it simpler to park and pay on our streets. Meters have been removed but new kiosks will accept quarters or bills. Ten hourly parking spots will be added on Riverside Drive across from the Philipse Manor train station. Parkers may utilize these spots in the Manor and pay via the Park Mobile App for convenient day trips via Metro North.
- The Village has begun its 150th anniversary celebration with new events each month to engage all parts of our community.
- Updates by the Headless Horseman statue on Route 9 across from the south end of Philipse Manor and Philipsburg Manor site are underway through a NY state grant. While it looks messy now, completion with new crosswalks, plantings, and more, is expected by spring/summer.
- The Village received a \$4.5 million New York Forward Downtown Revitalization Grant last year and completed planning with community involvements. Projects recommended to New York State for funding include a re-use of the former Strand Theatre into an arts, community and cultural center; the creation of a permanent pocket park at Cortlandt Street and Beekman Avenue and updates to the Morse School plaza. The Village expects to hear back from New York State by June 2024 regarding which projects have been chosen for funding.
- The Village has received approximately \$3.2 million in incremental grants so far this year. The largest is a State of New York grant to our Local Development Corp with only 25% match, which is planned for the East Parcel to create fields, parks and a promenade along this property just south of Devries Park. The project is underway and will focus on parking, lighting, racquet courts and a skate park.

Andrew Beshara TREASURER. Andrew joined the Board in 2023, after moving to the Manor in 2022. He is leveraging his experience in financial services to help keep our finances in order.

Jaap Ritzen SECRETARY. Jaap joined the Board in 2020 and has taken on many roles since. He began leading the Maintenance Committee but has transitioned to be our Recording Secretary. A retired news reporter, she is the third member of the Communications team and has taken on the role of content creator for the quarterly newsletter and our Facebook page.
